Welcome to this 2015 Winter Edition which begins with some breaking news. At the recently well attended meeting our parish church PCC announced they would fund the solar panel installation on the village hall roof using funds from the St Michaels & All Angels Church Hall sale fund. This extremely generous offer made up of £7,000 grant plus £7,000 loan will enable the 12kw installation to go ahead immediately avoiding the government's 90% cuts to the feed in tariff on Jan 1st. For the Shop it will mean a huge reduction in electricity bills as well as some physical annual income. On behalf of the Shop team and the Village hall committee we would like to thank our parish church PCC for this generous and community minded gesture from which the whole community will benefit.

In the Spring edition we featured Eamon Morris and his role as our Vale of Clwyd First Responder. We mentioned that Pwllglas resident Eamon was having to raise funds himself towards his own first aid kit and in particular the costly defibrillator. Since highlighting this plight, Eamon has received generous donations from Sharon Newell, Bryn Hyfryd who held a pamper evening and raised £100, Chapel y Rhiw £200 and Pwllglas parish church £300. In addition, Siop Pwllglas have now collected another ton of plastic tops, these tops are heading off to our friends in Bodelwyddan at the Plastecowood factory where they are made into wood looking plastic outdoor furniture and fencing items. *In return Plastecowood will happily donate towards Eamons defibrillator fund.* For the *first* ton we collected earlier in the year we received from Plastecowood the two large flower planters outside the shop and also the bespoke outdoor storage box. Again thank you to them and to you all. Please keep collecting your plastic tops (milk, laundry, soft drinks etc) so we can support another local community cause.

The Pwllglas Food Festival was a great success with plenty of stall holders selling locally made products and gifts. Demonstrations from Pwllglas residents Imogen and Rowan Hodgson owners of On The Hill Restaurant proved very popular. The carved pumpkin competition was won by the Agnew family, Tan Y Bryn. Gina Povey also from Tan y Bryn won the Chutney class. Thanks to Rotary Ruthin & Pwllglas parish church for their kind donations towards running costs. Llwyddiant i Ysgol Llanfair yng Ngala Nofio Ranbarthol yr Urdd:


